MT ROUSE LOOKOUT

Another of the major attractions of Penshurst is the lookout and associated walking trails on Mt



Rouse. The current state of this facility leaves a lot to be desired, and when it is compared with similar facilities, such as those on Mt Leura in Camperdown, presents as being positively shabby. The current condition of the stairs to the summit is decayed and dangerous. While council advises that funds are available and that the stairs will be refurbished, it appears to be a low priority and the works have yet to commence.

Other facilities in the area are also in poor condition and do not reflect well on our community. A visit to the dilapidated toilet facility is a far from pleasant experience and a new, clean facility should be considered. The shabby, neglected state of this area makes it far from welcoming and indeed must be leaving a very poor impression on visitors. I suspect this attraction is not high on the priority list for council attention and would like to see community members press councillors for action in this regard. Let me know what you think.







A PAGE TO SHARE RECIPES

The following recipes were submitted by readers this week.

SCALLOP BUBBLY

Ingredients

1 lb scallops, thawed

Pepper

2 tbsp margarine

1/2 cup chopped onions 1 cup sliced mushrooms

1 & 1/2 cups chopped celery

1/4 cup flour

1 cup chopped green pepper

pinch of salt

1/4 cup margarine extra

1 tsp salt

2 cups milk

1 cup soft bread crumbs

Method

Sprinkle scallops with pinch of salt. Melt 2 tbspn of margarine in a frypan and sauté onions, celery, mushrooms and green pepper until tender. In a separate saucepan, melt 1/4 cup margarine, blend in flour and salt then gradually add milk, stirring constantly until mixture thickens. Mix in scallops and sautéed vegetables. Pour into a greased casserole dish. Sprinkle bread crumbs on top and bake at 180 degrees C for 20 to 25 minutes. Serve on a bed of rice. Yields 6 servings.

EASY QUICHE

A no fuss, no base needed quiche recipe to which you add whatever filling you like. I like it as the ingredients are always in the house.

Ingredients

4 eggs 1 1/2 cups milk


3 tbs butter melted 1/2 cup self-raising flour


1 1/2 cups cheese grated 2 cups mixed filling finely chopped

Method

Preheat oven to 180C. Whisk together in a bowl: eggs, milk, butter and flour. Fold in cheese and fillings. Pour into a 24cm quiche dish. Bake for 40 minutes or until set. Serve hot with vegetables or cold with salad. Serves 6.




