



Christmas pudding doesn't have to take so much effort when you can simply pop it into the trusty slow cooker

Slow Cooker Christmas Pudding

INGREDIENTS

375 g packet dried mixed fruit
1 Granny Smith apple, cored, peeled,
coarsely grated
200 g packet natural coloured glace cherries, finely chopped
1 cup dried sweetened cranberries
½ cup brandy
cooking oil spray, for greasing

½ cup dark brown sugar
½ cup golden syrup
175 g unsalted butter, melted
3 free-range eggs, lightly beaten
1 ½ cups fresh breadcrumbs
1 cup self-raising flour
3 tsp ground cinnamon
thick vanilla custard, to serve

METHOD

Step 1 Combine fruits and brandy in a large bowl. Stand, covered, overnight.

Step 2 Lightly spray a metal pudding steamer (8-cup capacity) with cooking oil. Line base and side with five x 6cm wide strips of baking paper.

Step 3 Add sugar, syrup, butter, eggs and breadcrumbs to fruit mixture. Mix well. Stir in combined sifted our and cinnamon. Pour into prepared steamer. Smooth over top.

Step 4 Place a pleated piece of baking paper and foil over top of steamer. Tie firmly with string to secure. Cover with metal lid.



Step 5 Place a small, heatproof saucer (4cm deep) upside down in the centre of a removable bowl of a 5- to 6-litre capacity slow cooker. Sit steamer on the saucer. Pour in enough cold water (about 7 cups) to come 3/4 of the way up the side of steamer. Cover cooker tightly with two sheets of foil. Cover with lid.

Step 6 Cook on high for 6 hours. Pudding is cooked when a skewer inserted into the centre comes out clean. Remove steamer. Stand for 30 minutes. Remove lid and foil. Turn out pudding onto a plate. Remove lining paper.



Step 7 Serve warm pudding with custard.







We are fast approaching the Festive Season or more affectionally known as the silly season. It is a time for warmer days (albeit, hard to imagine with the recent weather), spent outdoors with family, friends and work colleagues. Invariably this takes place in the form of social functions and good old get togethers. When punctuating the year that was, events like these are important to recharge and to build and maintain those relationships which are important to us. However, please remember;

Have fun but drink responsibly.

If you are going to drink, then don't drive.

Don't use your mobile phone whilst driving. It's not that important, the text can wait.

Check the signs and please stick to the speed limit. They are there for a reason.

Other considerations this time of year:

We already had one Total Fire Ban Day. Please ensure that you have reviewed/created your bushfire plan before the Fire Restriction Period commences. If you own a smartphone download the **Vic Emergency App**, it's a great little information resource. Also visit the **CFA Website** for further information and assistance.

Scammers, online fraudsters and traveling conmen. They are known by many names however, the one thing they have in common is that they part you from your hardearned cash. In nearby Hamilton and Dunkeld there's been recent reports of workmen offering maintenance/repair works at a fraction of the cost with the promise of a shiny warranty or guarantee. The workmen would then charge more than quoted and the quality of works are later found to be questionable. The only guarantee being that the workmen, and your money, will be long gone. Rule of thumb for all scams, online fraud and traveling conmen; if it sounds too good to be true, then it generally is. Also, if you are the recipient of an unsolicited call asking to provide your personal or credit card details, alarm bells should be ringing. If in doubt, ask for a number to contact them back on instead. If they start to get angry or pushy about the request, you are probably talking to a scammer.

The Australian Competition and Consumer Commission (ACCC) has a terrific resource called www.Scamwatch.gov.au that provides information on how to identify, report and more importantly, protect yourself against these scammers.
