LATER START TO OUTDOOR SWIMMING POOL SEASON

The Southern Grampians outdoor swimming pool season will be pushed back due to a lack of lifeguards and the recent flooding events experienced across the region. The Hamilton Outdoor Pool, which normally opens from the first weekend in November, will start a few weeks later while staff work to undertake important water clean-up and work towards finding solutions to inadequate staffing levels.

Outdoor pools in Penshurst, Glenthompson, Balmoral, Dunkeld and Coleraine will open later in December to patrons while these issues are addressed.

Manager Community and Leisure Services Susannah Milne said the impact on the outdoor pools is unfortunate but necessary to ensure facilities are safe for residents.

“The recent rain events experienced across the region have left us with some clean-up works to make sure the water quality is up to standard for our swimmers,” said Ms Milne. “We are also working on finding solutions to our staff shortages. While the outdoor pool season will be pushed back, this will ultimately enable staff to ensure safety for patrons.”

Ms Milne said some tough decisions were going to have to be made in relation to operating hours with heavily reduced number of lifeguards available for the season. “We are facing significant challenges in relation to staffing shortages. A lack of trained lifeguards is something we have been struggling with over the last couple of years which we know is not isolated just to the Southern Grampians but is an issue felt across Victoria,” said Ms Milne. “Locally, if the numbers don’t increase and increase rapidly, the operating hours of our outer town pools will be impacted heavily due to those high staff shortages. We are asking community members to step up, complete the training, sign up as a lifeguard and help ensure these facilities can be enjoyed this summer.

“Lifeguards employed by the Southern Grampians are part of the Council team. With secure working conditions, guaranteed shifts, great pay rates and career progression opportunities – there are many benefits to joining Council. If you are new to lifeguarding or if your accreditation has lapsed – get in touch with us and we will help with training to get you out onto the pool deck,” concluded Ms Milne.

Southern Grampians Shire Council Mayor Cr David Robertson said local swimming pools were the heart of small communities so would be disappointing for Council to have to resort to reduced opening hours. “Last year, the outer pools were impacted by a lack of staff and this year will continue in a similar fashion unless we get committed community members who live in our outer townships to put up their hands, step up for training and put back into these communities,” said Cr Robertson. “Lifeguarding is not only a great summer job but could be the kick starter you need for a new career with Council. There’s still time to complete your training so reach out to Council as this is one way you can contribute to the wellbeing of your fellow residents,” concluded Cr Robertson.

Caramut and District Garden Club

Despite all the wet weather, since it's become so warm and windy, the garden, especially pots will dry out so check via the finger meter as to whether you need to water again.

Now that it's warmed up at last, most vegetable seeds or seedlings can now be planted. If planting seeds, a fine spray of water regularly will be required to enable germination. If a strong jet of water, it will wash the seeds away. The finer the seed which is planted close to the surface will need more watering than larger seeds which are planted deeper.

There's still time to divide old dahlia clumps. Plant single tubers for better, bigger flowers. Make sure there are two or three buds or shoots at the top of each tuber.

Divide old bearded iris clumps as the flowers wither and discard the old rhizomes. The rhizomes of bearded iris tend to grow and flower at the end while the older section will die off.

The Christmas gathering of the Garden Club will be held at Woolsthorpe on Tuesday 13th December. Members exchange a home grown plant, so don't forget to bring along your plant and raffle tickets for a hamper donated by Mary Underwood's daughter. There will still be time to buy a ticket on the day. Happy Gardening.

GROWING HRLX AS A BUSINESS FOR THE FUTURE

Southern Grampians Shire Council adopted the 2022 Hamilton Regional Livestock Exchange (HRLX) Strategic Vision as developed by the HRLX Advisory Committee (HRLXAC) at last night's ordinary Council meeting. The development of the strategic vision will look to ensure future sustainability of the facility, whilst growing opportunities for the livestock market within Southern Grampians.

The strategic vision outlines HRLX to:

- Operate as a commercial enterprise;
- Build on its position as the premier sheep market sales facility in Western Victoria;
- Consolidate and expand its position as a cattle market;
- Be a best practice facility encompassing environmental, biosecurity, and compliance requirements;
- Continue to contribute to the social and economic fabric of the Greater Hamilton region.

Southern Grampians Shire Council Mayor Cr David Robertson said the adoption of the strategic vision as presented by the HRLXAC will ensure the facility is positioned as the premier livestock exchange in Western Victoria for decades to come.

"The strategic vision helps Council to position the HRLX facility as a business that has significant impact on the region in terms of enterprise and economy," said Cr Robertson. "The development of this vision helps to support the direction and retain focus for Council and the Advisory Committee to change the culture and commercial focus to increase contribution to Council and community.

Over the past few years, we as a Council have made significant progress and investments to improving the facility in terms of infrastructure. The development of the vision and provision to develop a five year business plan, which will be developed over the next 12 months, is the next step in maximising the potential for our livestock facility. I would encourage anybody interested in this vision and or future direction of HRLX to contact Council for more information," concluded Cr Robertson.

Council also resolved to develop a five year business plan for the facility, continue to progress the review of fees and charges as a priority, allocate funding to complete essential biosecurity works specifically security gates, and to consider a budget allocation within the 2023/24 budget to undertake renewal of the outdoor unpaved cattle yards subject to budget and business case.

Today's story begins on the 8th of August, 36,000 feet above planet earth, on a plane somewhere over Europe, when someone suddenly falls seriously ill.

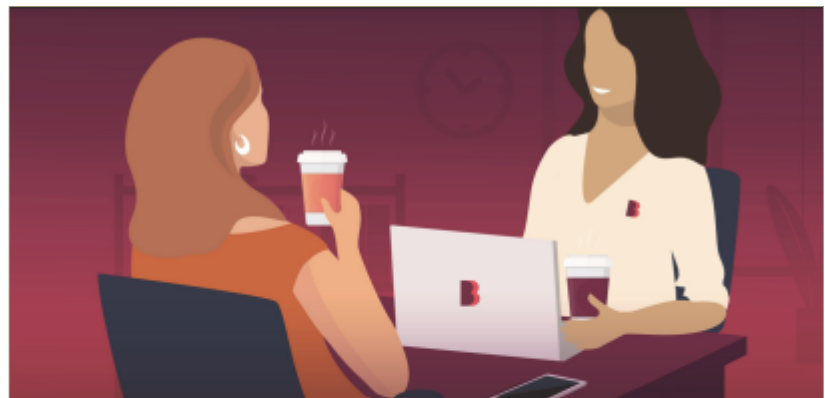

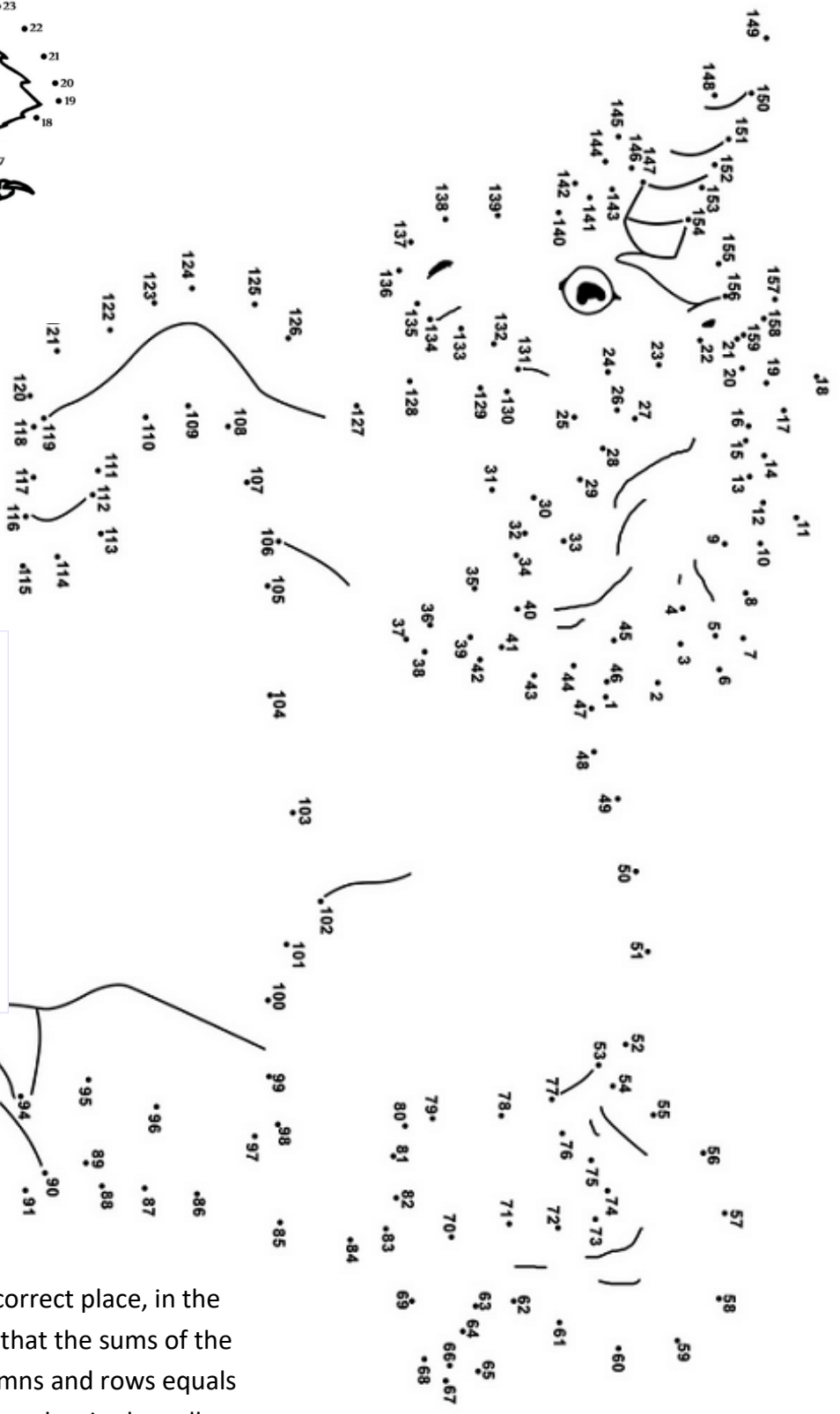
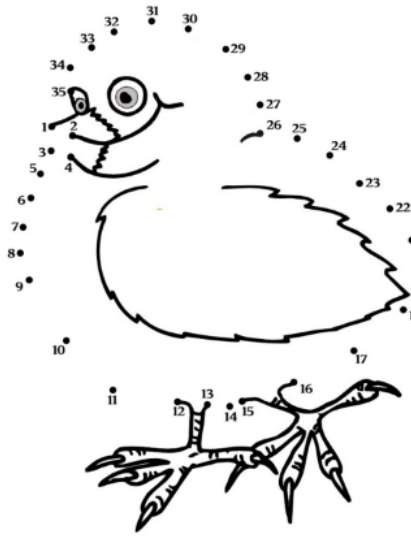

A PAGE TO SHARE RECIPES

Pasta with Mint and Parmesan

Prep Time 5 mins Cooking Time 10 - 12 mins Serves 3 - 4

INGREDIENTS

240g wholewheat fusilli
 knob of butter
 1 large shallot, finely chopped
 140g frozen peas

2 skinless salmon fillets, cut into
 chunks
 140g low-fat crème fraîche
 ½ low-salt vegetable stock cube
 small bunch of chives, snipped

METHOD

STEP 1

Bring a pan of water to the boil and cook the fusilli according to the pack instructions.

STEP 2

Meanwhile, heat a knob of butter in a saucepan, then add the shallot and cook for 5 mins or until softened.

STEP 3

Add the peas, salmon, crème fraîche and 50ml water. Crumble in the stock cube.

STEP 4

Cook for 3-4 mins until cooked through, stir in the chives and some black pepper. Then stir through to coat the pasta. Serve in bowls.



Garlic Bread

Prep 10 mins Cook 7 mins Serves 6

2 ciabatta loaves
 140g butter, softened
 4-6 garlic cloves, crushed
 handful parsley, chopped
 2 tbsps finely grated Parmesan (or vegetarian alternative)



Slice the bread in half lengthwise. Toast the crust side for 2 mins until really crispy. Mix together butter, garlic and parsley in a bowl. Spread over the cut bread halves. Sprinkle over the Parmesan. Just before serving place on a baking sheet, then cook under a hot grill for 5 mins until toasty and lightly golden. Let it cool for 1 min before cutting into thick slices.

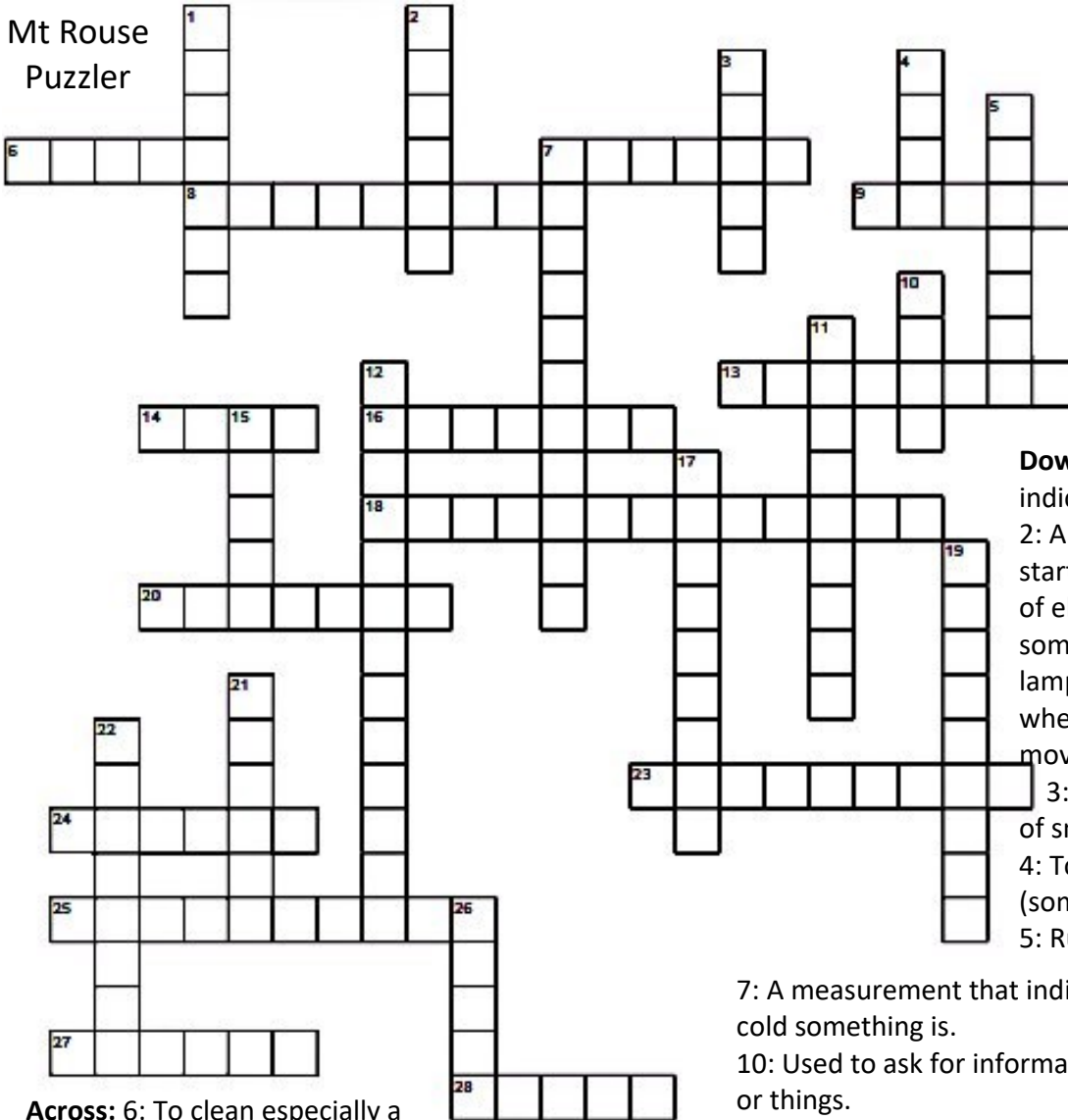
