Good afternoon everyone,

A quick note from last fortnight. The Christmas Party will now be on Friday 8th December in the *future generations." (From the Strategy guide)* Penshurst Botanic Gardens, where Santa will arrive at 7pm, after the children from both our schools sing us a Christmas Carol, accompanied by Paul Sutherland, who will add some more Christmas cheer of his own. We thank everyone for being so willing to be part of the activities that evening.

Something important - the Council wants to have another Engagement meeting in town, with two themes. The first is to introduce the Small Towns Strategy that they are applying across the Shire, and the second is a lesson in how to apply for items to go into the Council's Budget each year. That lesson will include a timetable about 'when' we have to have those submissions in. These activities will take place at the Hall on (insert date). I know the notice is short, but with Christmas looming, the next PPA meeting being the AGM, which is also our last meeting for the year, the sooner we know the better. We hope that as many people as possible will be there because these projects are important for the town's future, not just for individuals.

The Council's vision for Penshurst:

"Being a small regional town, Penshurst could increase its stature in the hierarchy of towns and ensure that it grows as a healthy, happy and connected places for people to live, whilst encouraging growth in tourism and associated activities. Through this, Penshurst should enhance and add to its community assets to ensure that it grows as a viable and liveable community. Finally, considering Penshurst has

wonderful natural environs and features, these assets should be sustained and preserved for

We've also been advised that the Council will be doing a building assessment on the Public Toilets in town. Hopefully that will lead to major improvements in all of them. Don commented on the condition of the Gardens toilets, which require a really good clean. We were told this would be arranged. He is also going to fix the Kolor Hostel sign outside the hall, which acts more like a weathervane at times.

Over the upcoming newsletters we will share the new heritage plaques that have been appeared around the town. This is an ongoing project as we have finished nine of the 31 locations to replace or create with the help of the Mount Rouse Historical Society and the Mt Rouse & District Lions Club. Our other cooperative project, the Mervyn Napier Waller Green Space will have its official opening early next year. The information boards are being designed at the moment and the gardens being planned. Once those are completed we'll be looking for more projects around town .. hopefully tied in with the Town Strategy.

Historic Plaques around Penshurst

The PPA, with the help of Mount Rouse Historical Centre and Penshurst & District Lions Club, has been gradually replacing the plaques on the historic buildings around the town. Have you stopped to look. Below are two. We will share more in the coming newsletters.



Penshurst Courthouse Physical description:

The building is a typical single storey court house with a central room and offices at the rear. It is built of bluestone with a cement ronder. High level windows light the main chamber and there is a fireplace on the eastern wallwith marble maniles. The bench for the magistrate, the winness box and other futings, as well as loose furniture survive. The building is of historical significance because it was the location for the administration of justice for the district for over a century. The intactness of its nineteenth century interiors provides an accurate interpretation of its former use as a practicing court.

In 1864 the newly installed Mount Rouse Shire lobbied for a courthouse to hold sittings of Petty Sessions. The Courthouse was designed by the Public Works Department architect, A. T. Snow, and built that year. It cost £3,851 to build. The adjacent post office (on the left in the photo) was built 12 years later and joined to the courthouse. Horse posts were installed in 1878. It was in use until the final case was heard in 1975.

In 2007 members of the Mt Rouse & District Historical Society became Trustees for the Courthouse under formal arrangements with the Victorian
Department of Sustainability and Environment. It now houses the Society's historical collection.

Penshurst Hotel

Charlie Mibus sold the Hotel a ton of potatoes for four pound fifteen shillings; a ton of chaff for three pounds; nineteen cattle 38 pounds; oats six shillings and ten penæ and fowls elevenshillings. Richard Barnes, carpenter, barrowed five pound and one shilling and then another three pounds from Joseph Tilley at the May 1890 Wickliffe races. The most popular drink was whiskey, a bottle costing five shillings, as did gin, rum, wine and shery. Part wine was five and six, Schnapps six shillings and dearest of all was brandy at six shillings and six. pence. A bottle of larger beer cost one and six. Half a dozen small ale bottles cost five and six.


The Pershurst Hotel was built for William Murphy in 1861. By the mid 1880's it was owned by John Frewer and was known as Frewer's Hotel. J Tilley bought the hotel at the start of 1888 and Mrs Tilley started a Day Book (debit account) which recorded the hotel's business and loans. In 1895 the hotel was severely damaged by a fire although on March 4 the Hamilton Spectator reported that the large dining room, the billiard room, kitchen and all the outbuildings were rescued from the flames. On June 5 the Western Agriculturist newspaper reported that host Joseph Tilley was determined to erect asuitable and substantial building ... a balcony, back staircase and bathroom would be important additions.

The Hotel was also the stopover for Cobb and Co. Coaches, six times a week, between Hamilton and Koroit. Later the Western Stage Company also stopped at the hotel. Horses were stabled for a shilling a night and a horse could be hired for two shillings a day with businesses induding Taylor and Wilson, Cruidsshank and Waters and Harrower and Daymond using this service. In addition, a driver

 and buggy could be hired and on February 25, 1889, Richard Elijah hired a driver and horses for one pound six shillings for three days.

Easy Fish Pie

Prep Time 15mins Cooking Time 45mins Serves 4-6

INGREDIENTS

1kg mashing potatoes, peeled and halved 400ml milk, plus a splash 25g butter, plus a knob 25g plain flour 4 spring onions, finely sliced 1 x pack fish pie mix (cod, salmon, smoked haddock etc, weight around 320g-400g depending on pack size) 1 tsp Dijon or English mustard ½ a 25g pack or a small bunch chives, finely snipped handful frozen sweetcorn handful frozen petits pois (peas) handful grated cheddar

METHOD

STEP 1

Heat the oven to 200C/fan 180C/gas mark 6. STEP 2

Put 1kg potatoes, peeled and halved, in a saucepan and pour over enough water to cover them. Bring to the boil and then simmer until tender.

STEP 3

STEP 5


When cooked, drain thoroughly and mash with a splash of milk and a knob of butter. Season with ground black pepper. STEP 4

Put 25g butter, 25g plain flour and 4 finely sliced spring onions in another pan and heat gently until the butter has melted, stirring regularly. Cook for 1-2 mins.



Gradually whisk in 400ml milk using a balloon whisk if you have one. Bring to the boil, stirring to avoid any lumps and sticking at the bottom of the pan. Cook for 3-4 mins until thickened. STEP 6

Take off the heat and stir in 320g-400g mixed fish, 1 tsp Dijon or English mustard, a small bunch of finely snipped chives, handful of sweetcorn and handful of petits pois. Spoon into an ovenproof dish or 6-8 ramekins.




STEP 7

Spoon the potato on top and sprinkle with a handful of grated cheddar cheese.

STEP 8

Pop in the oven for 20-25 mins or until golden and bubbling at the edges. Alternatively, cover and freeze the pie or mini pies for another time.






